

Advocacy Priorities

 Evaluate other models of statewide budgeting for a coordinated system of care.

Make New Hampshire communities more age-friendly

- Support state and local policies that offer more choice in transportation options so all of us can access services and supports as we age.
- Advance state and local policies that support flexibility in zoning and housing options to provide more choices.

Ensure the availability of a stable workforce of direct care workers to support us as we age

- Advocate for adequate increases in pay for the direct care workforce.
- Secure benefits, training and regulations that support direct care workers.

Create Age-friendly communities

HB1305

Exempts income from a homeshare arrangement from the determination of net assets for purposes of determining eligibility for certain property tax exemptions.

Exempt the rental of shared facilities to an occupant by an owner or agent of the owner from licensure and regulation by the New Hampshire real estate commission.
